To Market We Go Let's use the words to make up a story about going to a market.

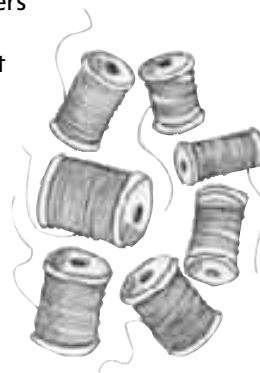

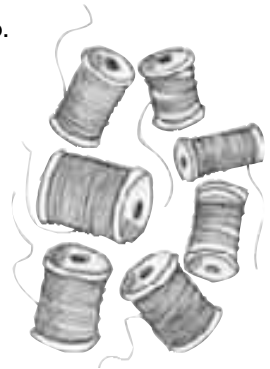

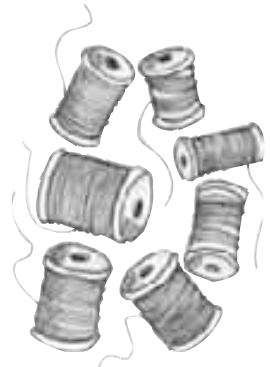
